

NY State Boating Law Equipment Requirements

- Valid registration documents on board
- Valid registration numbers on vessel
 - Must be displayed on both sides of the bow
 - At least 3" tall letters, in contrasting color from hull
 - Must be clearly legible, block style letters
- □ Valid Registration validation stickers
 - Displayed on both sides, with valid expiration date
 - Must be placed to the stern (back side) of the registration numbers
 - Documented vessels do not have registration numbers however are required to obtain and display a valid registration sticker
- At least one life jacket for everyone on board
 - Children must have properly sized life jackets
 - Children under 12yrs must wear a life jacket whenever above deck while boat is in motion
 - Adults do not have to wear life jackets while on board at any time
- □ At least one type IV throwable floatation device
 - Can be the square seat cushion type or a round lifesaver style

- One sound producing device
 - Must have a functional horn or blow whistle
- Anchor and line
- □ Engine must have a backfire flame arrestor
 - · Most engines come standard with it
- One up to date functional B1 fire extinguisher
 - Vessels 26'- 40' must have two B1's or one B2
 - Vessels 40'- 65' must have three B1's or one B1 and two B2's
- □ One day-time distress signal
 - Either an approved orange USCG flag or a day-time approved flare
- □ Three night time distress signal flares
 - Check for expiration dates
- Operational Navigational lights (after sunset)
 - One red light on the left front bow, and a green light on the right front bow
 - One white 360 degree light to the rear of the front lights
- □ A Capacity plate for all vessels under 26 feet in length

NY State Boating Navigational Laws

- The speed limit in Irondequoit Bay is 25 mph
- While in Irondequoit Bay, there is a 5 mph speed limit within 200' of shore
- There is no speed limit on Lake Ontario away from shore
- 5 mph speed limit in any body of water whenever within 100' of shore, docks, or anchored vessels
- 5 mph speed limit within 500' of any designated swimming areas (Durand & Charlotte Beaches)
- 5 mph speed limit in the entire Genesee River and within the Irondequoit Bay/Lake Ontario channel
- No operating of motorized vessels within 100' of a divers flag
- Operator of a vessel must be at least 18yrs, or possess a valid safety certificate
- Operator of a vessel must not have ability impaired (drugs, alcohol, eyesight, etc...)
- Operator may consume alcohol, however may not become impaired or have a B.A.C. above .08
- Vessels may have open alcoholic containers on board
- It is unlawful to discharge of any waste, sewage or debris into public waters
- Water skiing/tubing vessels must have a spotter facing backwards who is at least 10yrs or older
- No towing water skiers/tubing past sunset or before sunrise
- Water skiers/tubers must have a life jacket on at all times
- Navigation lights must be on whenever operating a vessel after sunset and or before sunrise
- Anchor lights (just the white light) must be on while at anchor after sunset and or before sunrise
- Children under 12 yrs must wear a life jacket at all times when not in an enclosed cabin while vessel in motion
- Persons may not ride on the bow while vessel is in motion unless vessel is an approved open-bow vessel
- Jet Skies Must wear a life jacket at all times, have a sound producing device (whistle), a distress flag, an
 attached engine cut-off lanyard, a fire extinguisher, operator must have valid safety certificate, and may not
 operate past sunset or before sunrise. Jet skies must abide by the same navigational laws as all other vessels.

Valuable Information To Know...

- Irondequoit Bay is approximately 4 miles long and about ½ mile wide
- It takes about 5 minutes to get to the North end of Irondequoit Bay from Southpoint Marina
- It takes about 20-25 minutes to get to the Genesee River from Southpoint Marina
- It takes about 3 hours to get to Coberg Canada and 4 hours to Toronto from Southpoint Marina
- It takes about 9 minutes to get to Southpoint Marina by car from just about anywhere in Rochester
- Good spots to anchor and play in the water are:
 - ✓ In front of Marge's Bar just West of the Irondequoit Bay outlet, bring I.D. (10 min. boat ride)
 - ✓ Devil's Cove, just East before the 104 Bridge coming from Southpoint Marina (5 min. boat ride)
 - ✓ Durand Beach, about 2 miles West of Marge's Bar Beach (12 min. boat ride)
- The water is usually warmer in the Bay than in the lake, but the lake water is much cleaner
- The water is usually much clearer on calm days
- On some days, the water on the beaches of Lake Ontario is crystal clear, it's quite amazing
- The water is dirtiest after rain storms and on windy days, especially a North wind
- It's always easier to dock your boat in calm winds, so practice in the wind too
- If it's windy, call the marina and ask for assistance before docking, someone will come out to help you
- The air temperature is usually about 5 degrees cooler by the lake than in-land near your home
- Bring along mosquito repellant if you're going to be out past sunset
- Keep a small first aid kit on your boat because your going to need Band-Aids sooner or later
- Leave some sun screen on your boat for your guests to use, because they usually forget it
- Keep your main dock lines attached to your dock when you go boating, it's much easier to tie up again
- Keep extra dock lines on your boat for docking at other locations
- The Bayside Restaurant in the North East end of Irondequoit Bay only takes cash
- Southpoint Marina is the calmest water marina in Monroe County, we call it the "calm water haven"
- You will have the luxury of spending lots of time on your boat while tied to your calm water dock
- There is just something relaxing about being tied up to your dock among friends, drinking a Corona...
- If you bring snacks to your boat, bring extra everyone gets hungry on the water
- Ice melts quickly in your car that's why ice is available at the Southpoint Store for your convenience
- Bazil Restaurant has free take out delivery service to your docked boat, just call and place your order
- Bazil is busiest on Fridays & Saturdays between 6:30p 8:30p, delivery may take longer in those times
- Bazil has Call-Ahead seating, call about an hour before you want to eat, it works well to limit your wait
- Bring a camera once in a while when you go out boating, the memories will last forever
- If your leaving port for more than a day, fill out a float plan so if you get lost we know where to find you
- Be sure all your power is turned off before leaving your boat, jump-starting boats is a son of a bitch...
- If you see blue lights behind you, it's some sort of police agency, go to neutral and let them do the rest
- If you think your about to get a ticket, be as polite as possible and you may catch a break
